

Participation of the Commission for Development and Rights (CDAR) in the Multi-Stakeholder Round table:

(International Development Cooperation), Thursday, 3:00 pm - 4:30 pm

Gentlemen, esteemed guests,

I'm here today to talk to you about Yemen, a nation that has endured years of horrendous humanitarian misery.

- The war has significantly increased both hunger and poverty.
- Millions of children suffer from starvation.
- Millions of people have lost their houses due to natural disasters.
- the health care system is on the point of collapsing.
- Yemen also faces the risk of an outbreak of infectious diseases.

Although Yemen has received considerable support from the international community, it is still insufficient.

Assistance must be expanded to all facets of life and drastically increased.

In order to bring about a fair and long-lasting peace in Yemen, as well as to create a better future for Yemen and its people, we must cooperate with one another.

To make sure that no one is left behind, we must cooperate while taking into consideration the unique requirements and conditions of each nation.

Establishing international development cooperation is essential to creating a world that is more equitable and prosperous.

Together, we can create a more sustainable and tranquil world for everybody. While achieving the Sustainable Development Goals won't be simple, it is achievable if we collaborate and work as a team.

Let's take advantage of this chance to improve global development cooperation and create a more promising future for all people.
