Event Overview

This official side event explores innovative financing mechanisms and inclusive models that enable youth to lead sustainable development initiatives across sectors.

Aligned with the Fourth International Conference on Financing for Development (FFD4), the session will focus on mobilizing cross-sectoral support through public-private partnerships, blended finance, and targeted policy reform to accelerate youth-led solutions that promote inclusive growth, decent work, and climate action.

Background and Rationale

In an era of escalating global challenges—climate change, economic inequality, youth unemployment—young people are stepping up as leaders and solution-creators.

Their innovative mindset and entrepreneurial spirit are critical to realizing the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Yet, a significant financing gap persists that limits the scaling of youth-led innovations.

This session responds to that gap by convening stakeholders from across sectors to explore how we can build financing systems that are inclusive, responsive, and accountable to youth.

It also aims to align with the broader objectives of the ECOSOC FFD Forum and FFD4 by focusing on strategies that unlock capital for youth entrepreneurship, green jobs, and equitable growth.

1. What innovative financing models can support youth-led solutions for sustainable development and inclusive economic growth?

- 2. How can public-private partnerships and development finance institutions more effectively invest in youth entrepreneurship?
- 3. What are the most pressing financing barriers for youth-led projects, and how can they be addressed through policy and practice?
- 4. How can youth from marginalized communities gain greater access to capital, networks, and mentorship to scale their impact?
- 5. What role can youth themselves play in reshaping financing systems for future generations?
